















'Nursery is the first place where children and parents can learn and negotiate behaviours and form the future citizens that can manage complexities.'















#### Health and education services....

- More frequent health contacts for all children in the first three years
- Greater access to psychologists and community paediatricians at universal level
- Well-trained and supported early educators who can help parents to develop their skills
- Greater recognition of the role of universal services in supporting parents

- encourage parents to support each other
- visibly recognise and celebrate partnership between parents and professionals and children
- bridge the gap between the child's life in a service and at home so that skills and knowledge are shared between parents and professionals
